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Introduction

Julia Belden Lockwood was born in the summer of 1881. She was a daughter of Col. Frederick St. John Lockwood and Caroline Ayres Lockwood of Cedarhurst, East Ave. She had elder siblings Elizabeth (born in 1868) and Frederick Ayres (1870-1966). She graduated from the Vassar College in 1901. She also took agricultural courses at the Connecticut Agricultural College in 1912 and at the Massachusetts Agricultural College in 1914. She excelled in many sports, most notably tennis and golf. Julia Belden Lockwood also traveled a lot and wrote detailed journals about her trips. She moved to California in 1925. She was single and died in 1976. Her brother married Alice Jane Drew (1885-1984); they had no children. Her sister married Frank Hubbard; they had two daughters.

Her father, Col. Frederick St. John Lockwood, was born in 1825 in Norwalk. He was President of the Fairfield County National Bank at Norwalk and of the Danbury Norwalk Railroad Company. In 1866 he married Caroline Ayres (1844-1919), a daughter of Frederick Seymour Ayres and Nancy Raymond Ayres. He died in 1907.

Col. Frederick St. John Lockwood had a brother named William Buckingham Eliphalet Lockwood who was born in 1822. He married Mary Manice in 1856. She was a daughter of De Forest Manice and

Catherine Booth Manice. William and Mary Lockwood had three sons: Manice De Forest Lockwood (born in 1858), Buckingham Lockwood (born in 1859) and William Buckingham Eliphalet Lockwood (born in 1862). The eldest son married Ann Lawrence and had two children: Mary Catherine Lockwood (1881-1881) and Manice de Forest Lockwood Jr. (1886-1977). Manice de Forest Lockwood Jr. married Mabel Goodsell Farrington in 1918. He was a lieutenant in reserve in the US air force. It was this last Lockwood who donated his inherited collection of antiques and the funds to construct a house where they could be exhibited to the city of Norwalk. This became the Lockwood House. Later Julia Belden Lockwood bequeathed her possessions to this museum as well.

Col. Frederick St. John Lockwood and William Buckingham Eliphalet Lockwood were sons of Col. Buckingham St. John Lockwood (1774-1850) and Polly Esther St. John Lockwood (1783-1850); they also had a sister Julia Abigail Lockwood (born in 1809).

Scope and Content Note

The Julia Belden Lockwood Manuscript Collection at the Norwalk Public Library is housed in three file boxes. It mostly contains Miss Lockwood's correspondence. Box 1 contains photographs, newspaper articles and memorabilia related to Julia B. Lockwood, in addition to the correspondence. Box 2 consists entirely of correspondence. Box 3 contains her travel journals and other travel memorabilia.
